




Taste a

Draw in sand some of the things you want to say sorry for. Smooth it away and say "Amen".

Build a den or prayer tent to create a quiet space where your toddlers can go to spend time with God.




Darken the room. Switch on a torch/battery operated tea light. Thank God for Jesus, the light of the world.




Tell God things you're worried about. Blow bubbles and give the worries to God as they pop or float away.



Wrap treats and hide them in shredded paper. Each pull one out and thank God for all His gifts to us.








Stick plasters

Give thanks for all the reasons you have to celebrate.
Blow some party blowers together and say "Amen".

Draw prayers on paper squares then fold in the corners. Float the paper on water to see the prayers released.



Mould your favourite food with a lump of play dough. Thank God for the food we have to eat.



Blow feathers in the air and see them float down. Give thanks for the Holy Spirit that came on wind and fire.



Create static on a balloon and each stick a square of tissue paper to it. Thank God for always being close.







Bat balloons around to music. Stop and give thanks for things the same colour as the balloon you're holding.

sorry and wash

away with water.



Make something from your imagination with pipe cleaners/tin foil. Thank God for the gift of creativity.



Draw someone on a paper doll that you want God to bless. Hang them up and remember to pray for them.




Cover everyone with a parachute by sitting under it and tucking it round. Thank God for His protection.




Light candles for a number of things you are thankful for. Blow the candles out together and say "Amen".



Clean some dirty pennies in a pot with vinegar and salt. Thank God for His forgiveness which makes us new.



Make fingerprint pictures. Look at everyone's unique print and thank God for making us all special.

Seperate Oreo cookies. Look at the dark side and the light. Thank God for providing light in the darkness.



Toss a beach ball around.
Pray for each person that catches the ball. Make sure everyone is included.







Give everyone a brick to build a tower. As each child adds their brick invite them to ask God for something.

Spend time quietly listening to the sound of the sea in a shell. Ask God to help us listen to Him.

Take your shoes off and examine them carefully, inside and out. Ask God to guide us on our journeys.



Give everyone a zip, or find zips on coats and cardigans. Thank God for bringing friends together as you zip the zips up!
